In Tashkent for carpet weaving specialists organized training on the use in this area a special computer program **Galaincha**. It was organized by the Chamber of Commerce jointly with the GIZ «Promoting sustainable development of the economy in some regions of Uzbekistan,” reports “Turkiston-press.”

Classes were conducted by national experts together with foreign experts. They were attended by manufacturers of handmade carpets, designers, teachers and students of the National Institute of Arts and Design Kamoliddin Behzod. They got the skills necessary for the production of handmade carpets using high technology, in particular, a special computer program **Galaincha**.



This software is an efficient and convenient tool for design, visualization, painting and carpet production. The program allows the manufacturer to assess the flow of materials, such as wool or silk, and know in advance the percentage of their use, which allows to calculate the cost of the finished product.

The program also has a special feature that allows you to convert and use in the design of the carpet any picture or photo, thus ensuring accuracy of design and time savings.

Domestic weavers appreciated this feature. It allows you to create the future carpet ornament pattern on the computer, so the finished product is the most appropriate plans website.

As noted by foreign experts, product Uzbek carpet weavers and designers of high quality and unique national ornament. In conjunction with information technology, these benefits will help to increase the success of Uzbek carpets in the world market.

Carpet weaving occupies a special place in the development of this form of management, as home-based work. Given the prospects of this form, now in Uzbekistan takes considerable work on the development of home-based work that stimulates employment and welfare.

In particular, the incentive in this direction was the adoption of the presidential decree “On measures to stimulate the expansion of cooperation between large industrial enterprises and services based on the development of home-based work” on January 5, 2006, and the Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic “On measures to promote and expansion of family businesses and the craft activity “from July 29, 2009.

Currently, carpet-making is common in many regions of Uzbekistan and covers about 30 thousand households.

Special courses for specialists in the field are held for further development in this direction handicrafts in the country and the subsequent expansion of exports of carpet products.

The first two phases of the training took place in November 2013 and February 2014.
